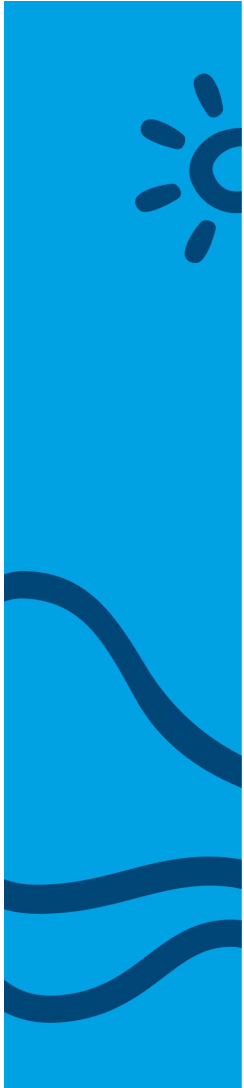

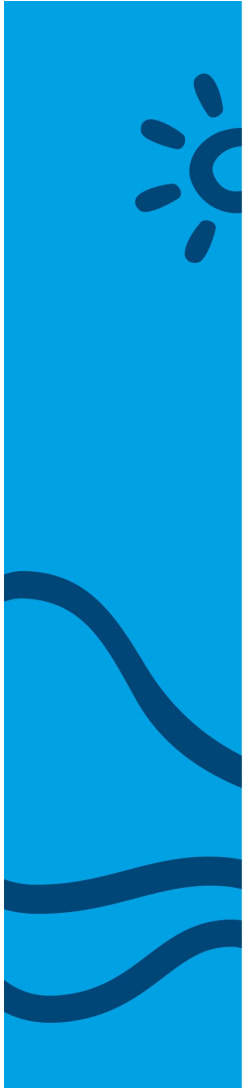

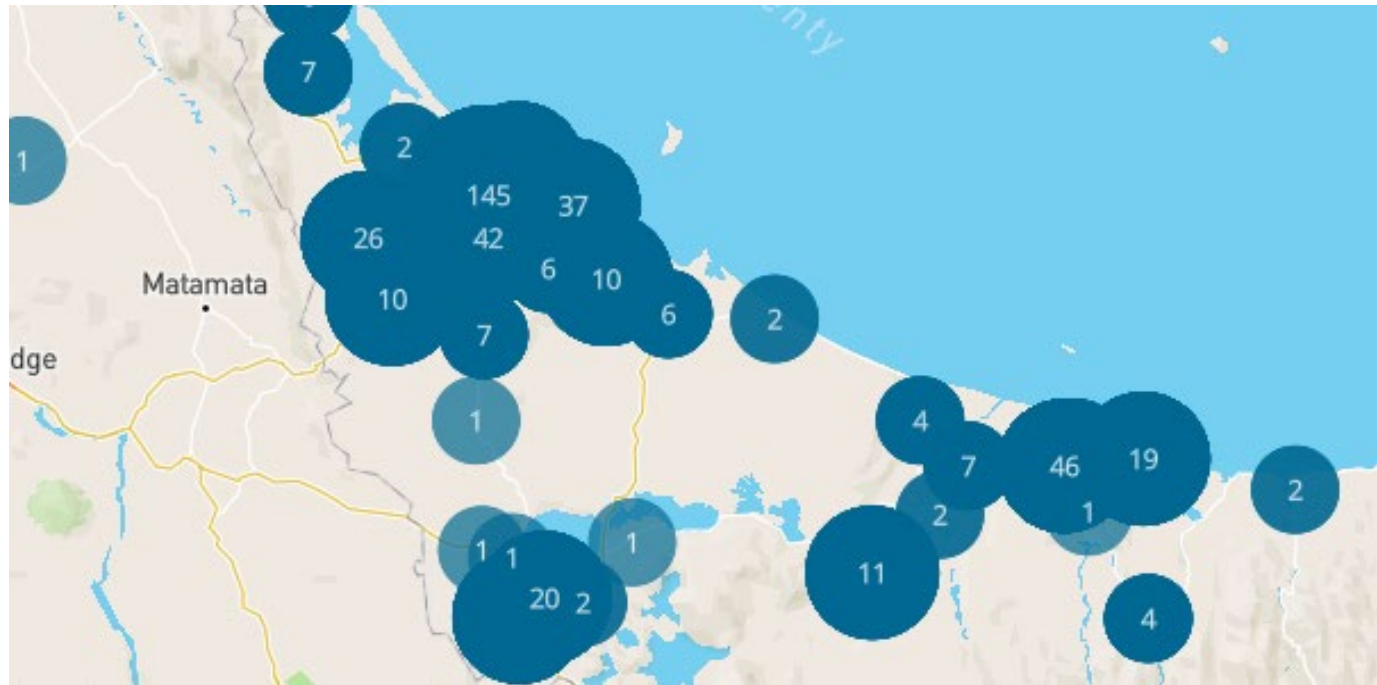

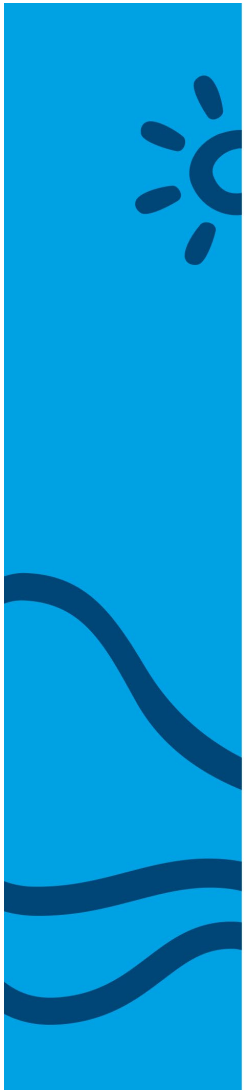


SSRF Public Voting Round

Funding figures	What it means	
\$6.9M	Total MPI baseline funding allocation for NZ wide Wallaby Programme.	This is divided between Otago, Canterbury, Waikato/BOP, Auckland’s Kawau Island eradication, support for Te Arawa Kahui, research and MPI’s programme management.
\$1.75M	The share of the above MPI contribution that is provided to the North Island Programme.	
\$2.25M	The above figure plus the \$500k contribution from Waikato Regional Council.	
\$2.55M	Total annual funding envelope for the North Island programme	Includes \$300k contribution from BOPRC

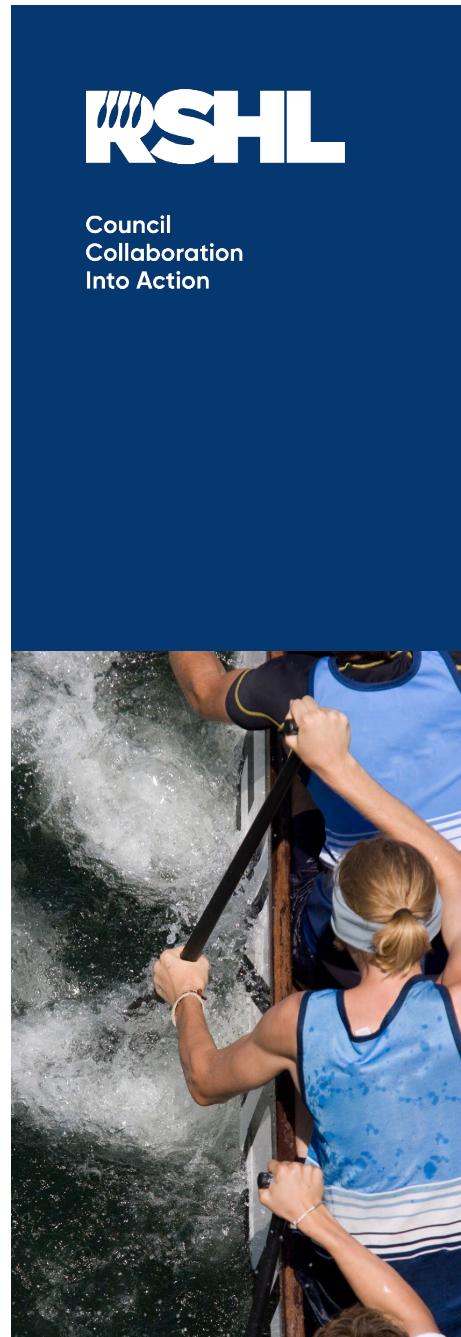

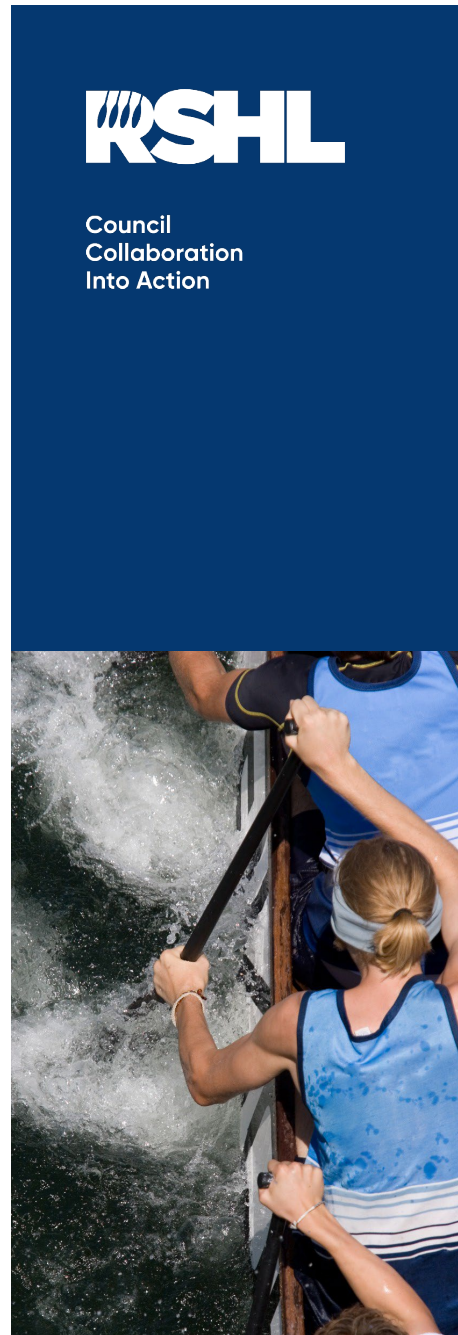

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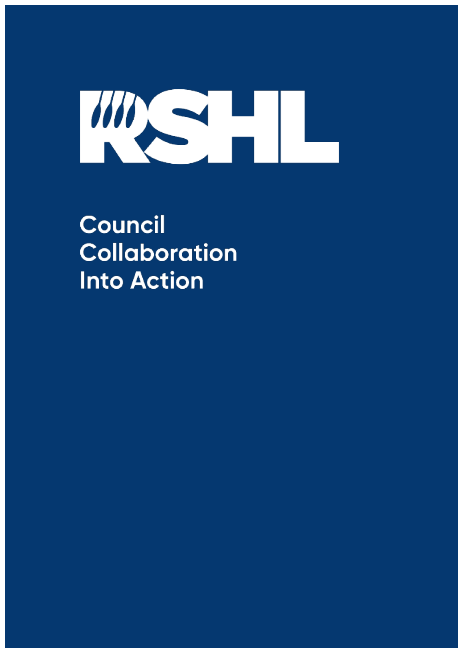
