Project background

Active Whakatāne Strategy – District-Wide Transport and Recreation Strategy 2020

- Rangitāiki Cycleways a long term vision of a connected network
- Stopbanks around Whakatāne Safe Ways to School and commuter access
 - Awatapu Trail
 - SH30 Shaw Road Trail

- Considerable consultation completed for Edgecumbe Thornton trail
- Re-connect with Iwi, hapū, community stakeholder May July 2023

Final Design completed – July 2023
